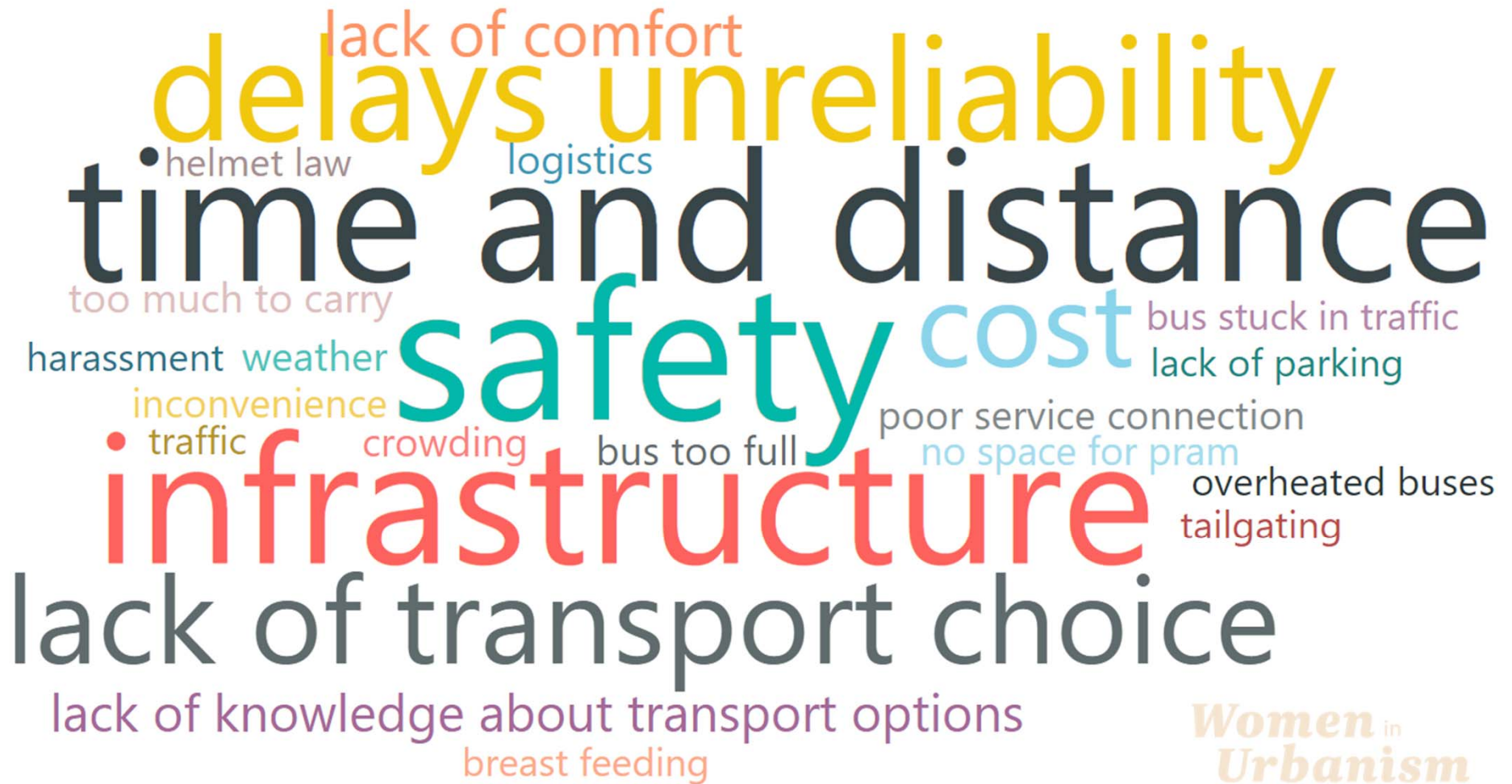
Women are more likely to:

Men are more likely to:

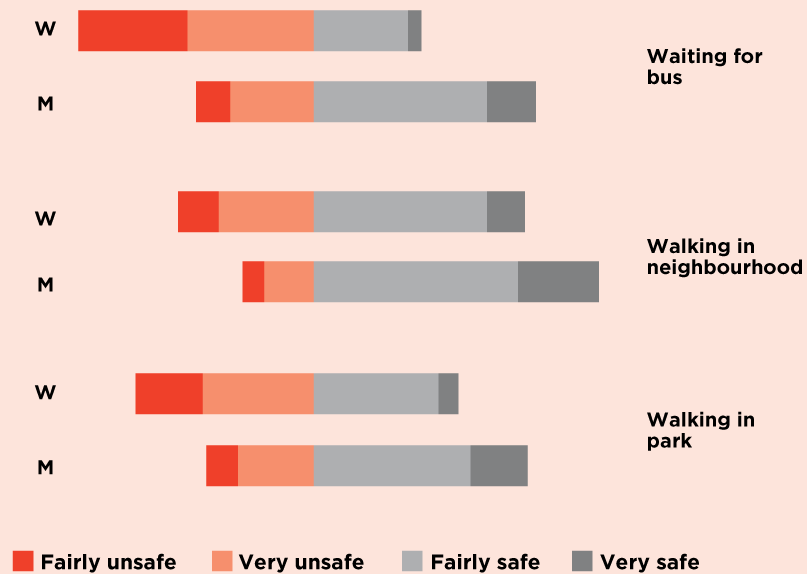
- Drive or cycle

What are the most common problems you face in your daily travel?

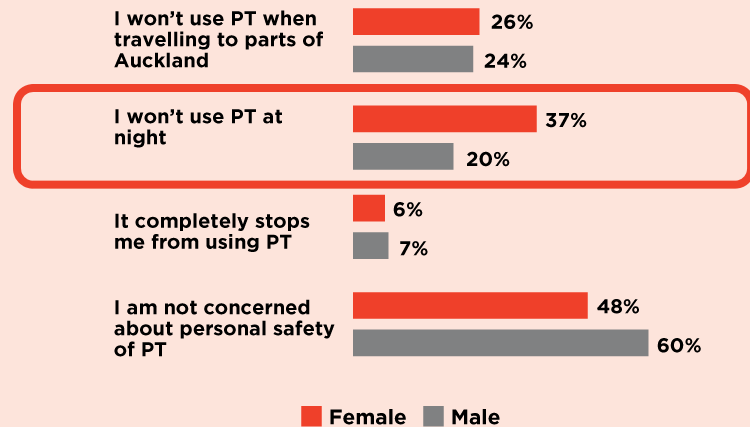


Our Cities don't work as well for Women as for Men

Personal safety barriers to public transport

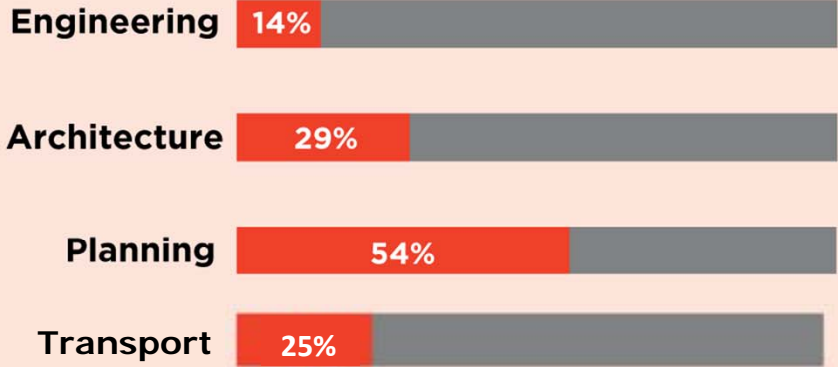

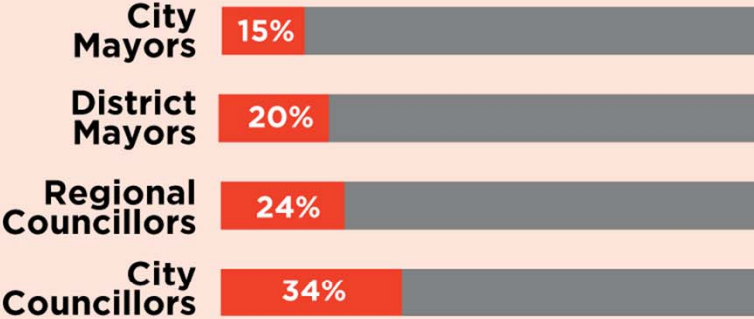
